

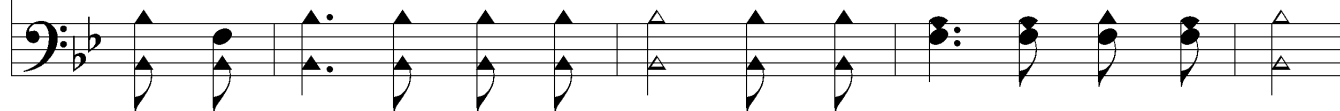
As The Growing Of The Corn



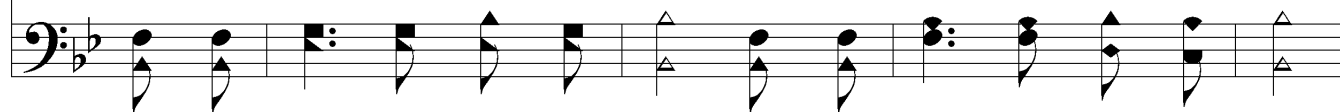
1. 'Tis not great e - vents that make Men and na - tions what they be;
