

Tossed Upon Life's Raging Billow

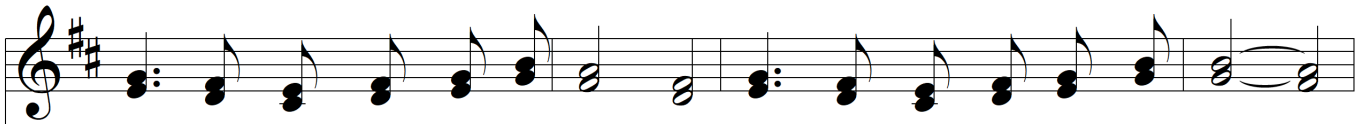
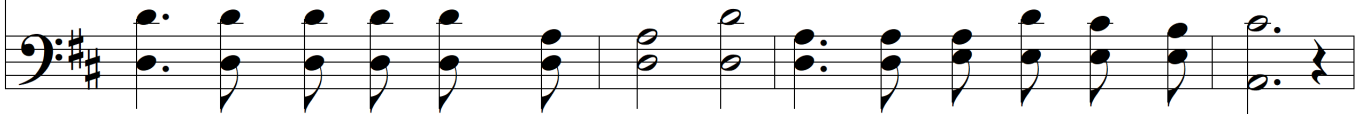
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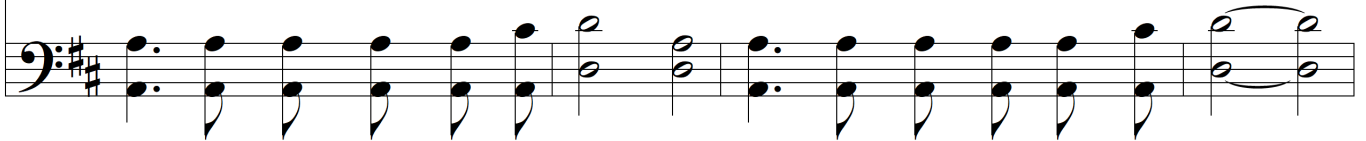
1. Tossed up - on life's rag - ing bil - low, Sweet it is, O Lord, to know,
